Buluwai Traditional Owners respectfully acknowledge the time and dedication undertaken throughout the years, in the recording of the Buluwai Tribal language. Buluwai is one of many tribal languages that constitute Far North Queensland's Wet Tropics Rainforest Aboriginal People's cultural heritage.

Traditionally, Aboriginal children were multi-lingual with many similar words shared with neighbouring tribes. However, tribal landscapes are uniquely different and because of this, Buluwai is proud to present our first version of Bibi Talk, Booklet One in the Cultural Activity Booklets Series (1-5).

Bama languages were never written on paper or stored in computers. Every generation was taught by their parents, brothers and sisters, aunties and uncles, grandmothers and grandfathers.




Bundarra is a spritual totem for Bama; believing that all life comes from the cassowary egg.

bulmba (ground), eg. Palms down, outstretched arms

bungan (sun), eg. Hands join over head and ams make a circle

gindan (moon), eg. Crescent moon shape with arms

gawai (star), eg. Twinkling stars with fingers
