In Kuranda, Bana Waruu (Barron River) forms the boundary for two Bama tribes (Aboriginal Rainforest People): north-side Djabugay, south-side Buluwai. We acknowledge and pay our respect to all our local Elders past, present and emerging.

As we highly value Bama culture as part of our Kindy Program, we are hoping that the children will be able to learn some local ngirrma (language) in our songs and rhymes and signs around the room. In consultation with the Community Elders (we are currently participating in a Community Consultation process), we hope to have visits from a Djabugay cultural language teacher Maria, and other local elders in the Kuranda Community who will visit at various times to teach the children about Bama culture.
